SUBJECT: United States Army Garrison Vicenza Policy Memorandum 30-14, Individual Logistical Support (ILS)

k. AER 550-32, Tri-Component Directive for Italy on Personal Property, Rationed Goods, Motor Vehicles and Drivers' Licenses, Civilian Component and Technical Representative Status, 20 February 2004.

2. Applicability. This policy memorandum supersedes United States Army Garrison (USAG) Vicenza Policy Memorandum 30-12, Individual Logistical Support (ILS).

3. General. Logistical Support, to include AAFES, commissary, and vehicle registration is a privilege offered to Soldiers, DoD civilians, authorized contractors, and their command sponsored dependents. Only individuals and organizations specifically delineated in the NATO SOFA, or subsequent international agreements between the U.S. and Italy, are authorized ILS. In the event of a conflict between DoD policy and the NATO SOFA or other international agreements between the U.S. and Italy, the NATO SOFA/international agreement will control.

5. Installation access is not classified as ILS. All installation access requests must be processed through the Department of Emergency Services (DES) Pass and ID section at DSN 634-7053.
